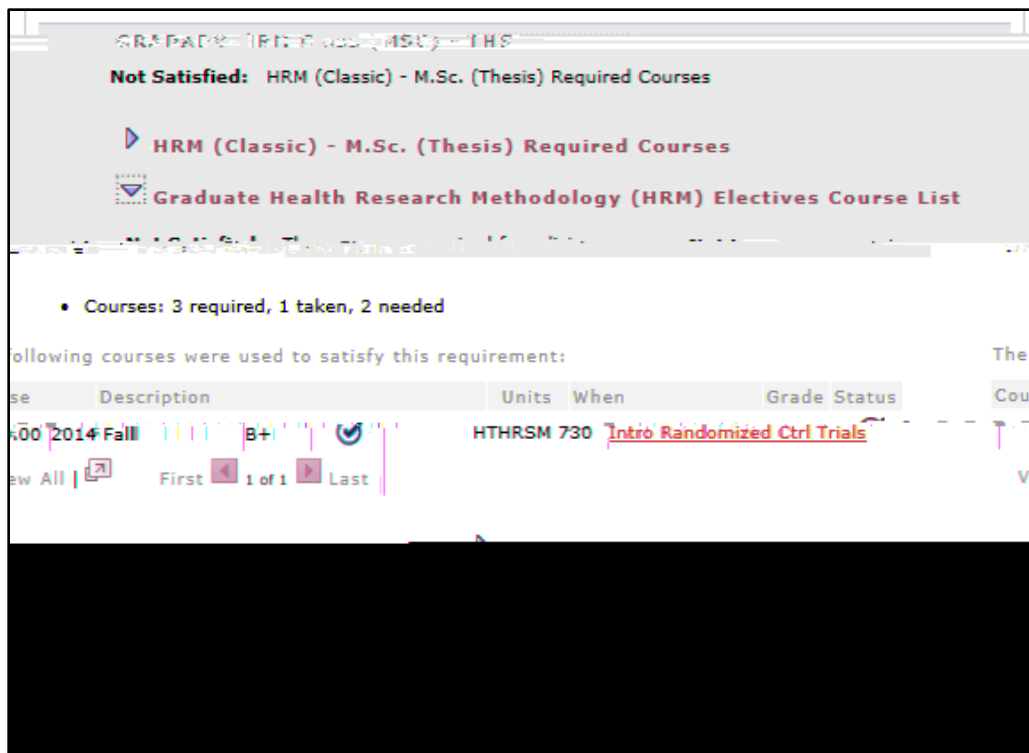
School of Graduate Studies Required Courses

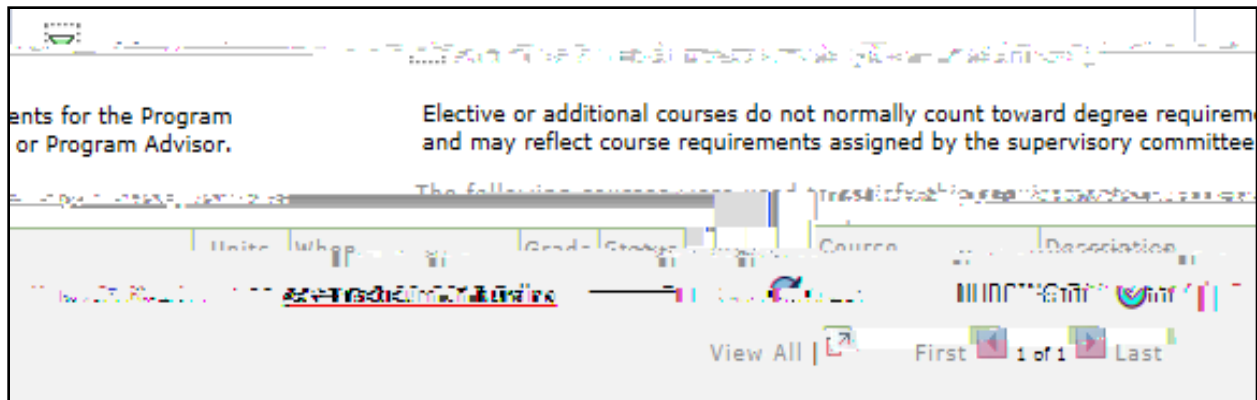
Example of Completed Milestones: Once a milestone has been posted as completed, it will show as “Satisfied” on the advisement report.

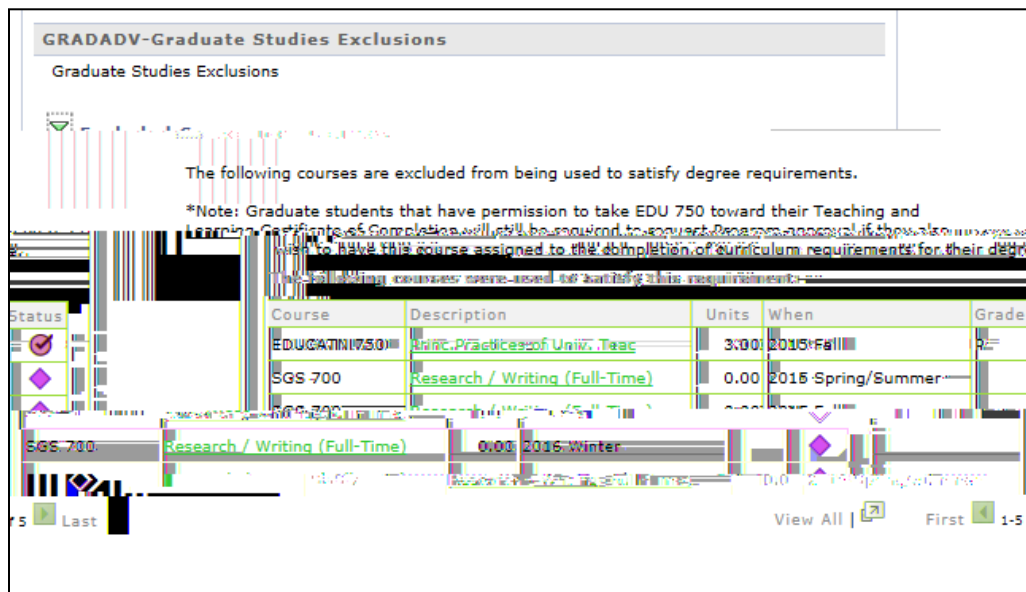
Note: Additional elective courses taken do not normally count towards degree requirements.
